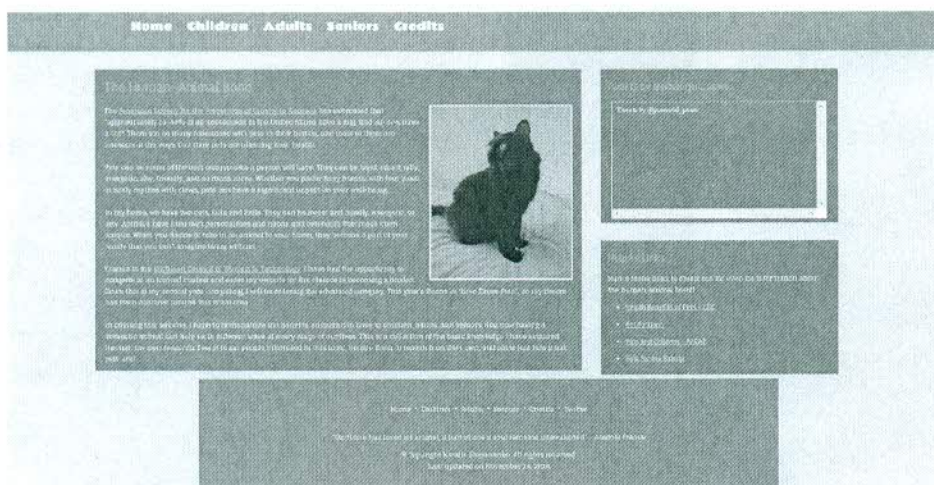

Page 2: Children

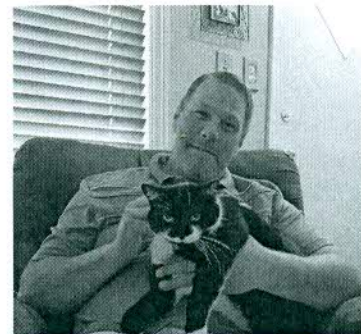

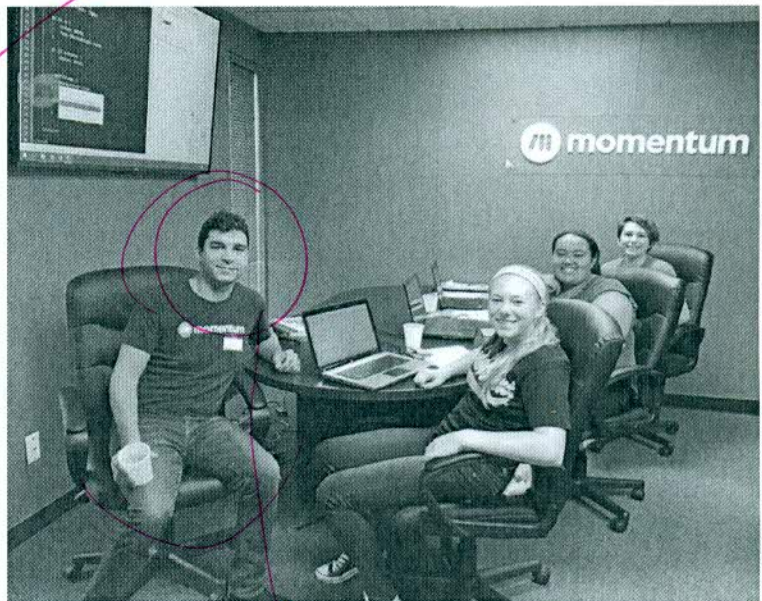
