Common Interview Q and A's

1) Tell me about yourself

My goal for school is to keep my straight A's. Like I said before, my grades are super important to me and I want to get in the best college I can so I can become a veterinarian or something else if I end up changing my mind. My goal is to get into the medical field, whether it's being a veterinarian or being a nurse. My mom, grandma, and aunt are all nurses so I would like to continue that line or at least something that's similar to it. My goal for outside of school and my future career is to become a better writer. Writing is fun and it is very important whether you are in school or not. So being a better writer will benefit me inside and outside of school.

2) What is your long-range objective?

1) Tell me about yourself: My name is Kayla and I am currently a Senior at Lake Shore High School! My favorite subjects are English and Social Science type classes such as psychology. I also love choir and newspaper class! I am on my schools newspaper The Shoreline. Outside of school I am a part of a dance company for my church (Our Lady Of Hope). I also enjoy volunteering to work with the elderly and younger children. I have been fortunate enough to have been selected to be a part of National Honor Society and National Honor Society. Having been chosen to be a part of these prestigious groups makes me push myself farther in school. I average a A/B in all my classes and am a honors student. My parents have always told me to just try my best, that's all they ever ask for; I like to go above and beyond their expectations because I know I can achieve anything if I put my heart and mind into it. People tend to tell me I am a selfless and caring person with a big heart. I would have to agree but I cannot help it, I just want to help people who are struggling more than me in life.

After I graduate I plan to continue at Macomb Community College for two more years in the nursing program (I have been a dual enrollment student for the past year) before transferring to Oakland University.
